CONTENTMENT: GRATEFULLY TRUSTING GOD WITH MY FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

I. THE CONTENTED STEWARD IS FINANCIALLY <u>DEPENDENT</u> ON CHRIST, NOT SELF (PHILIPPIANS 4:10-13).

- A. God's stewards choose to accept changing financial circumstances (4:10-11).
 - Stewards value relationships over money.
 - Stewards don't blame others for their financial need.
- B. God's stewards are content because they value Christ's strength above all else (4:12-13).
 - Stewards trust Christ's plan for them financially.
 - Stewards see themselves financially dependent on God.

II. THE CONTENTED STEWARD IS <u>GRATEFUL</u> FOR WHAT GOD PROVIDES (PHILIPPIANS 4:14-18).

- A. Stewards are grateful for those God uses to supply and bless them (4:14-17).
- B. Stewards are grateful because God is praised when He uses people to meet our needs (4:18).

III. THE CONTENTED STEWARD IS <u>CONFIDENT</u> GOD WILL PROVIDE ALL THEIR NEEDS (PHILIPPIANS 4:19).

Developing financial contentment

- 1. Focus on basic needs, not grand desires (1 Timothy 6:6-8).
- 2. Accept that more income may not be God's will (Luke 3:14).
- 3. Expect peace from God, not money (Hebrews 13:5).
