## **SERMON OUTLINE**

## The radical shift from self to service John 13:1-17

<u>Introduction to John 13-17:</u> Jesus' last task before dying on the cross was to show his love for his disciples (John 13:1; 17:26).

- I. Jesus humbly served his disciples by washing their feet (John 13:2-11; See context Luke 22:24-30).
  - A. <u>His thoughts Jesus had all authority</u>, yet was about to die, and Judas would betray him (13:2-3).
  - B. <u>His act Jesus showed true humility</u> by washing feet (13:4-11).
    - 1. Jesus stripped down, took a towel and water, washed and dried the disciples' feet (4-5).
    - 2. Jesus taught Peter a spiritual application (6-12)
      - Peter objected but Jesus said "foot cleansing" is a normal part of being a disciple (6-9).
      - Peter then wanted a bath, but Jesus said believers only need regular cleansing (10-12).
        - o Bathe, body clean Belief (John 3:16; 15:3)
        - Wash feet Fellowship (1 John 1:9)
- II. To follow Jesus we must humbly serve one another (John 13:12-17).
  - A. The Principle: We must serve like Jesus (13:12-16).
    - As Jesus served humbly despite his exalted position, we also must serve humbly whatever our position.
  - B. <u>The Promise</u>: God blesses those who make the radical shift from self to service (13:17).
