Parenting with truth and grace Colossians 3:20-21

Intro – Good or godly parenting (Colossians 3:17; Malachi 2:15)?

- I. Teach truth Children must obey parents because it pleases Jesus (Colossians 3:20).
 - A. "Obedience" Children learn to obey at home (3:20a).
 - 1. Parents are accountable to teach and enforce obedience (Proverbs 3:1-2; 19:18; 29: 17).
 - 2. Accountability to obey gradually shifts to the child (Proverbs 28:7; 30:17; 22:6).
 - B. "Pleases the Lord" As children learn to obey they also learn about pleasing Christ (3:20b; Ephesians 6:1-2).
 - 1. Children learn what God is like through daily time spent with parents (Deuteronomy 6:4-9).
 - 2. Teaching truth starts young (2 Timothy 3:14-16).
- II. Model grace Dads (and moms) must parent with grace or children are discouraged (Colossians 3:21).
 - A. Don't provoke children to anger (3:21a; Ephesians 6:3).
 - B. Lack of grace creates lack of hope (3:21b; Ephesians 6:4).

Grace-based parenting issues

- Do we <u>motivate</u> performance-based or grace-based (Colossians 1:10-14; 2 Corinthians 5:14-15)?
- Do we <u>discipline</u> fear-based or grace-based (Hebrews 12:5-11)?
- Do we <u>teach holiness</u> guilt-based or grace-based (1 Corinthians 10:13; 2 Corinthians 6:17-7:1)?
