## The destructive path of pride

2 Kings 14 (p. 303); 2 Chronicles 25 (p. 362)

## I. KING AMAZIAH OF JUDAH STARTED OUT HIS REIGN MOSTLY GODLY (2 KINGS 14:1-7)

- A. Did much right, but not wholeheartedly (14:4; 2Chron 25:2)
- B. Imitated Joash his father, but not godly David (14:3)
- C. Rightly executed his father's assassins (14:5-6)

## II. KING AMAZIAH BECAME PROUD IN VICTORY AND GOD JUDGED HIM (2 KINGS 14:8-20; 2 CHRONICLES 25).

- A. Edomite war Arrogance in victory (2 Chron. 25:5-16)
  - Hired Israel's army, but then sent them home (25:6-10)
  - Defeated Edom (25:11-12), but was raided by Israel (25:13)
  - Worshipped Edom's idols rejecting God's rebuke (25:14-16)
- B. <u>Civil war with Israel</u> Arrogance & loss (2 Chron. 25:17-28)
  - Declared war, rejecting warnings (25:17-19; 2 K. 14:8-10)
  - Defeated, captured, wall, treasures, hostages (25:20-24)
  - Assassinated 15 years later (25:25-28)

## The progression of pride that ruins our lives

- 1. Half-hearted obedience to God ignoring certain sins
- 2. Following questionable spiritual examples
- 3. Faith in numbers instead of faith in God
- 4. Seeking counsel from the world, and refusing God's counsel
- 5. Creating conflicts, trying to prove our importance
- 6. Living disciplined by God and humiliated before others
