## Failing to learn from failure

2 Kings 14:23-15:31 (page 304)

- I. JEROBOAM II (41 YRS) DID EVIL, BUT WON BECAUSE GOD CARED FOR THE GODLY (2 KINGS 14:23-29).
  - A. He restored boundaries other kings had lost (14:23-25).
  - B. The Lord cared how much his people were suffering and helped them in spite of how evil the rulers were (14:26-29).
- II. ZECHARIAH (6 MO.) DID EVIL, WAS ASSASSINATED BY SHALLUM (2 KINGS 15:8-12;)
  - His reign finished the prophecy about Jehu (2 Kings 10:30).
- III. SHALLUM (1 MO.) DID EVIL, WAS ASSASSINATED BY MENAHEM (2 KINGS 15:13-15)
- IV. MENAHEM (10 YRS) DID EVIL, HURT HIS OWN PEOPLE (2 KINGS 15:16-22)
  - A. Vented his rage against his own people (15:16-18)
  - B. Taxed his own people in an attempt to buy peace (15:19-22)
- V. PEKAHIAH (2 YRS) DID EVIL, WAS ASSASSINATED BY PEKAH (2 KINGS 15:23-25)
- VI. PEKAH (20 YRS) DID EVIL, WAS ASSASSINATED BY HOSHEA (2 KINGS 15:27-31)

## <u>Lessons from the final kings of Northern Israel</u>

- 1. God is sovereign over how long evil people succeed.
- 2. God often accomplishes good things through evil people.
- 3. Those seeking glory by controlling others end up despised instead.
- 4. Failure to take warnings is the path to discipline and disaster.
