Serving our holy God in a sinful world Isaiah 6

- I. GOD'S HOLINESS AND GLORY PREVAIL IN SPITE OF HOW SINFUL THE WORLD IS (ISAIAH 6:1-7).
 - A. <u>Angels, tremors and smoke</u>: Isaiah saw God in holiness and glory worshipped by angels (6:1-3).
 - 1. King Uzziah's great reign in Jerusalem was over (6:1).
 - Many still worshipped at high places (2 Kings 15:4).
 - Sin of all kinds marked the nation (Isaiah 5).
 - 2. Seraphim celebrated God as holy and glorious regardless of what mankind was doing (6:2-3).
 - B. <u>Angels and hot coals</u>: Isaiah acknowledged his sin in light of God's holiness and was forgiven (16:4-7).
- II. OUR HOLY GOD IS WORTHY OF OUR FAITHFUL SERVICE THOUGH FEW RESPOND (ISAIAH 6:8-13).
 - A. God called Isaiah to declare His word even though most would not respond (6:8-10).
 - B. God (who is holy) must eventually judge sin while a few who purse holiness willingly serve and obey Him (6:11-13).
