## Keeping the gospel clear and simple 1 Corinthians 15:1-8 – Core Value #2 (p. 933)

## I. THE GOSPEL ETERNALLY SAVES ALL WHO PLACE THEIR FAITH IN ITS MESSAGE (1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-2).

- A. The gospel (=good news) must be <u>declared</u> (15:1a; Acts 18:1-11).
  - Paul preached the gospel in Corinth.
- B. The gospel must be <u>understood</u> (15:1b).
  - The Corinthians received (= embraced as authoritative) the gospel and took their stand on it (= firmly believed).
- C. We are eternally <u>saved</u> by <u>believing</u> in the <u>gospel</u>, and trusting in anything else is worthless (15:2).
  - Saved from what? Eternal judgment (John 3:16-18, 36).
  - "Hold fast" (= maintain), "believe" (= place trust in)

## II. THE GOSPEL IS: JESUS DIED FOR OUR SIN AND ROSE AGAIN (1 CORINTHIANS 15:3-8).

- A. Jesus died for our sins (1 Peter 2:24; 2 Corinthians 5:21).
  - First importance This is the most important truth in the Bible because it brings eternal life (John 3:16-18).
  - According to the scriptures Old Testament scriptures foretold Jesus' death and resurrection (Isaiah 53:1-12).
  - Buried Proof Christ truly died on the cross (MMLJ)
- B. Jesus <u>rose from the dead</u> (15:4-8; 15:12-23; Matthew 28:6).
  - Appeared Proof Christ truly rose from the dead (MMLJ)

Core Value #2 - The Gospel – We want to keep the gospel clear and simple – We are all sinners unable to earn salvation. Eternal life is given by God to all who trust in Jesus Christ alone who died for our sin and rose again.
